1. This course explores and examines the biblical and practical understanding of The Tabernacle of Moses. There will be an emphasis on understanding the typology and how these apply to our lives. These were not simply patterns of design, colors and metals but were giving to be a pattern for living.

 - 8. Know why and how God sets the direction of our lives. Each footstep on the sands of the Sinai desert; each aroma; each metal; each tribe; each position and measurement will take on their Biblical meaning.
